

- Visit Ayalon Institute Shelli's Family and Parents This clandestine ammunition factory was built in 1945 by the Haganah. In just three weeks, preparations for the factory were completed and it was code-named the Ayalon Institute. Above ground, it appeared to be no more than a kibbutz. However, located eight meters below ground, this was the country's largest bullet factory. It has been said that the bullets manufactured at the Ayalon Institute played a crucial role in the success of the War of Independence.

DAY 4 SUNDAY, 24 DECEMBER 2023

- Optional: Ein Avdat National Park Hike in the Ein Avdat National Park, in a beautiful canyon in the Negev desert. The Ein Avdat Spring flows down in a waterfall towards an 8-meter deep pool of water. The canyon is part of Nahal Zin, which is the longest wadi or dry riverbed in the Negev desert.
- Ben Gurion's Desert Home Paula and David moved to their Desert home in 1953, following their acceptance as Sde Boker Kibbutz members, which manifested Ben-Gurion's pioneering vision of settling the Negev. Their home has remained as it was left in 1973, according to Ben-Gurion's instructions in his will, that his home will be open for the public to come visit. Since 1974, visitors can enjoy a tour of his home as they would if they were his own personal guests.

- Be an archeologist for the day! Explore Beit Guvrin National Park where you will be able to take part in an archeological dig. The caves of Beit Guvrin hold a rich trove of artifacts that visitors like you have uncovered over the years. Don't forget to check out the amazing Bell Caves too.

- The Western Wall Tunnels Shelli's Family Explore what's under the Muslim Quarter through the Kotel Tunnels Tour. The Western Wall is impressive, but its greatness is truly discovered when you descend underground to the Western Wall Tunnels. The tunnels run along approximately 488 meters (1601ft) of the Western Wall, giving visitors a taste of the challenge that stood before Herod the Great during the biggest of all his immense building projects the expansion of the Temple Mount.

- Weather permitting: Light and Sound Show at the Tower of David Museum Amidst the archaeological remains in the David Citadel courtyard, the story of Jerusalem unfolds through virtual reality images. The Night Spectacular uses trompe l'oeil technology the stones of the walls and structures fade into the scenes and the viewers are part of a multi-sensory experience.

DAY 6 TUESDAY, 26 DECEMBER 2023

- Tour Jerusalem's Old City And meet the people and places that make this place so unique. In the Jewish Quarter, uncover the layers of Jewish history from the time of the First Temple until the present day. In the Christian Quarter, visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Throughout the tour, explore the complexity of a city that is holy to the three major religions Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.
- Start with a short tour of the Jewish Quarter The Jewish Quarter is best known for the Western Wall, but there's a lot more to see and do here. See archaeological finds from the First and Second Temple periods, Roman ruins, vibrant synagogues, and learning institutions, all jostling for space in these busy stone streets.
- · Lunch on your own in the Old City
- Muslim & Christian Quarters Explore the maze of the Muslim and Christian quarters, meeting people who have
 lived in the Old City for generations, practicing their crafts and raising their families. Browse the famous Arab shuk
 (market) in the Muslim quarter. The Christian Quarter is home to a rich tapestry of Christians of many
 denominations. The historic and impressive Church of the Holy Sepulcher, encompassing the last 5 Stations of the
 Cross, dominates the area. Retrace the footsteps of generations of pilgrims, or eat some of Israel's best hummus
 at one of the authentic restaurants in the quarter.

- Dinner at MachneYuda "This restaurant is considered one of the best in Jerusalem, possibly the country. Celebrity
 chef, Assaf Granit, grew up in Jerusalem and pays homage to the city's colors and cacophony in his elegant dishes.
 The menu changes twice daily, but it nearly always includes chamshuka, a fusion of chopped meat and hummus,
 and a raucous dessert ceremony of ice cream flung on tables covered in aluminum foil."

- Masada National Park Ascend the mountain from the east to explore Masada, scene of the epic stand by Jewish
 rebels at the end of the Great Revolt against Rome nearly 2,000 years ago. The new museum at the Visitor Center
 reveals the secrets of the daily life of the rebels, the story of the excavations, and how the site became one of
 Israel's most important symbols.
- Dead Sea Boat Ride Take a boat ride on the Dead Sea in a small group motorboat or in kayaks and see amazing salt formations and scenery. During this unique experience you will enjoy the wondrous muds, salt pearls, salt diamonds, water springs streaming to the sea and sink holes filled with sweet water. Learn about the ecosystem and the environmental issues connected to the Dead Sea.
- Lunch by the Dead Sea
- **Dead Sea Bike** Bike in the spectacular scenery of the Dead Sea. Several route options available depending on the level of the riders. Riding off-road, explore the area between the mountains and the sea in the stunning quiet landscape of the area. (special sits and bikes are available for the younger crowd)

- Option 2: Workshop in Genesis Land Genesis Land is situated in the heart of the Judean desert, on the way to the Dead Sea, in the land where the Patriarchs lived. A magical place, it enables visitors to experience life as it was in biblical times. Participate in fun workshops like mosaic making, pottery, etc and enjoy a biblical style meal.
- Option 3: Israel Aquarium Check out the new Israel Aquarium, a huge aquarium that tells a fascinating submarine story. Visit the "Four Seas" gallery, where you will find an extraordinary exhibit of Israel's seas namely, the Mediterranean, Red Sea, Sea of Galilee, and the Dead Sea.

- Kfar Masaryk Kibbutz Experience The Secrets of the Kibbutz Miracle-fascinating tours through kibbutz living. At the beautifully renovated original kibbutz buildings, visitors can get a glimpse of early 1940s kibbutz living the pioneers (Halutzim), clothes, rooms, and pastime culture.
- Akko historical tour Walk through 4,000 years of history in this ancient city and UNESCO World Heritage site. The
 ancient city of Akko, situated on the Mediterranean coast, is one of the oldest ports in the world, and a city shared
 by Jews and Muslims. Walk narrow streets past towering ramparts, deep moats, green domes, venerable
 synagogues, slender Muslim minarets, and secret passageways. Discover the subterranean city built beneath
 Akko in the Middle Ages by the Crusaders. Learn about the city's ancient history, as well as its important role in
 Israel's modern history.

DAY 10 SATURDAY, 30 DECEMBER 2023

- Ein Keshatot (Umm al-Kanatir) Ein Keshatot is is one of about 30 Jewish villages that existed in the Golan during the Talmudic Period, which was period of great growth in the area. The synagogue building was constructed in the 6th century CE (approximately 500 years after the destruction of the Second Temple), and was the center of local communal life. It served as a place for prayer, reading of the Torah, and various public activities.
- Druze Cooking Workshop and Dinner Together with your hosts in their private home, prepare traditional Druze Galilean dishes and then enjoy a dinner of the foods you create. Learn about Druze culture and history from your hosts and from the food you eat.

- Dialogue in The Dark at the Children's Museum A sensory experience for those who've already seen it all. Get to know the world and other people without the benefit of your sense of sight. Swap roles with your sight-impaired guide and discover your other, dormant senses. Hearing, touch, smell, and taste when sight no longer dominates your senses, how do you perceive your environment? You'll find your daily routines seem utterly different in the pitch-dark exhibition. Under the care of your sight-impaired guide, a walk in the park, the noisy city, and a boating excursion become real adventures. At the end of the tour, you'll reach a café where you'll be served by blind waiters. There, you can discuss your experiences with others. Dialogue in the Dark is based on social creativity. It sets the stage for real and meaningful human interaction. Dialogue in the Dark is not an exhibition about blindness; rather, it's about human non-visual awareness. Dialogue in the Dark challenges our prejudices.

 become a joyful, colorful place. Many say this is Tel Aviv's best market for variety, price, people-watching, and
 authenticity. The Hatikva Market was built in the mid-1930s as a response to the Arab Revolt, when residents of
 the village of Salama stopped coming to the neighborhood to sell their goods. What began with a few produce
 stalls put up by local residents of Iraqi, Yemeni, Syrian and Iranian background grew into a sprawling market
 spread out along the triangle of Ha'Etzel, Hahagana and Hatikva Streets.
- Travel to colorful Kuchinate: African Refugee Women's Cooperative For a coffee ceremony and to hear the story
 of this incredible social start-up. Meet founders Diddy Mymin Kahn and Sister Aziza, who have turned the lives of
 refugee women around by empowering them to find their voices and regain their dignity after very difficult life
 circumstances.
