### DAY 2 SATURDAY, 19 DECEMBER 2026

- **Enjoy a day of leisure to explore the north on your own** Enjoy a day of leisure to explore the north on your own

- **Kfar Blum Kayaks Rafting Adventure** Rafting wet adventure along the Jordan River. Row through one of the most beautiful spots in Israel, amongst the plants, trees, and small water rapids in the middle of this beautiful Galilee nature reserve.
- **Short hike to Tel Anafa**
- **Agamon HaHula** Ride through the spectacular Hula Valley on bikes or golf carts. The Hula Valley is part of the northern Syrian African Rift Valley which stretches as far south as Mozambique in Africa. Each migration season, over 500 million birds travel through the Hula Lake. This wetland paradise is the perfect stopover for small water birds, cormorants, herons, pelicans, raptors, storks, and cranes.

# Golan Heights

**DAY 3 SUNDAY, 20 DECEMBER 2026**

- **Breakfast at the hotel**
- **Golan Heights Jeep Tour** Take a geo-political tour of the Golan Heights with an expert. While traversing the rich landscape, learn about the history, flora, and fauna of the area. Stop for a lookout over the border with Syria from Mt. Bental to get a better understanding of the geography and strategic role this region has for the State of Israel. Your local guide touches on the nuances of living so close to the Syrian border and what that has meant for Israel as it relates to security and humanitarian issues.
- **Aniam Artist Village** On the way to our next stop we stop at Aniam Artist Colony, the first and only artist colony on the Golan Heights.  
The creative artists of Aniam work in diverse medias: gold and silver jewel crafting, painting, pottery, ceramic sculpture and decorative tiles, drawing on wood and glass, sewing of tablecloths, bags and pillowcases for domestic use, artistic frames and pictures, and original children's' games.
- **Tel Winery** Tel Winery is a woman-owned micro boutique winery, offering intimate tours led by the passionate and knowledgeable Lital. All wines are single varietal, made exclusively from Northern Golan grapes and feature high acidity and fruits flavors which provide for a refreshing sip.
- **Um el Kanatir (Ein Keshatot)** Um el Kanatir, also known as Ein Keshatot, is home to a Jewish village from the Period of the Mishna and Talmud, with a magnificent synagogue in its center. Enter a synagogue that features the original Ark Complex – the most preserved and magnificent ever to be discovered in Israel. The synagogue was excavated and reconstructed with advanced technological methods, and today it stands at a height of one story. The Ein Keshatot site also offers a visit to the village spring, which flows into ancient pools, surrounded by shaded areas.

## Safed & Galilee

### DAY 4 MONDAY, 21 DECEMBER 2026

- **Breakfast at the hotel**
- **Tzfat (Safed)** Safed, pronounced Tzfat in Hebrew, sits at a higher altitude than any other city in Israel and has been known since the 16th century as a major center of Kabbalah, Jewish mysticism. Tzfat's mystical aura adds to its special status as one of Israel's four holy cities, along with Jerusalem, Tiberias, and Hebron. The old synagogues, narrow alleyways and artists' studios add to the hilltop city's unmistakable charm.
- **Optional: Mezuzah Workshop** Please note - this can be for part of the group, if some of the family members have other plans for Safed
- **Druze Cooking Workshop** Together with your hosts in their private home, prepare traditional Druze Galilean dishes and then enjoy a meal of the foods you learned to cook. Get to know your hosts and their culture and history. Hear about the strong bond between the Druze community to the State of Israel and their contribution to the IDF. Dinner is included.
- **Visit and tour of the old flour mill** Including a tour in the olive groves, just as the olive harvest has ended.
- **Drive back to the hotel and dinner on own** Or have the Druze meal for dinner, with lunch at Safed on own.

# Nazareth & Lower Galilee

**DAY 5 TUESDAY, 22 DECEMBER 2026**

- **Breakfast at the hotel**
- **Optional: Nazareth Christmas tour** Set in the Lower Galilee, Israel's biggest Arab city, Nazareth, is a fascinating place. It combines traditional, simple Arabic charm, Christian history, and grand old Arabic architecture. Nazareth is home to many important early Christian sites, including the Basilica of the Annunciation, Mary's Well, and the Synagogue Church, as well as an authentic, living Arab souk (market). Celebrating Christmas in Nazareth is a magical experience, where the spirit of the season fills the air. Visit the Basilica of the Annunciation and immerse yourself in the city's rich biblical history
- **Off-Road ATV tour** Explore the Galilee area with its scenic views, fresh air and excellent routes, and varied terrain . You'll be in the driver's seat!
- **Visit and tour Ein Camonim (including lunch)** Ein Camonim is Israel's first boutique cheese dairy Learn about the cheese making process and eat a delicious lunch including the farm's organic cheeses.
- **Korazim National Park - sunset tour** A Jewish town in a basalt landscape overlooking the Sea of Galilee. The beautiful synagogue at Korazim was the center of the community in the time of the Talmud (3rd to 5th century CE), and known for its extraordinary basalt carvings, the region's most common stone, which depict floral and geometric patterns permitted by the Jewish law. This will be a great place for a Bar Mitzvah ceremony.

## Coastal Classics: Akko, Haifa, & Caesaria

### DAY 6 WEDNESDAY, 23 DECEMBER 2026

- **Breakfast at the hotel**
- **Check out of the hotel** And head west
- **Tour Akko** Explore the enchanting Akko Old City on a historical and cultural tour. The ancient city of Akko is situated on the Mediterranean, is one of the oldest ports in the world, and is a city shared by Jews, Muslims, Christians and even Bahai. Walk narrow streets past towering ramparts, green domes, venerable synagogues, slender Muslim minarets, and secret passageways, visit local artists' studios and meet local vendors. Learn about the city's ancient history as well as its important role in Israel's modern history.
- **Lunch on own in Akko**
- **The Bahai Gardens** A magnificent scenic lookout over the Baha'i Gardens and Haifa's Bay all the way to the border with Lebanon. Admire the garden's captivating terraces, gracefully cascading towards the Mediterranean Sea, while discovering the history of this sacred site and the principles of the Baha'i religion. Haifa's vibrant landscape unfolds a tapestry of cultures, religions, and historical layers.
- **Caesarea National Park** On the Mediterranean coast, Caesarea National Park is one of Israel's most impressive archeological sites. Explore the 2,000-year-old Roman theater, Crusader harbor and 12th-century ramparts. The city was initially built by King Herod in the 1st century BC, who dreamt of a major seaport to connect the Province of Judea with Rome. View the spectacular Roman amphitheater, still used today as a performance venue, as well as the hippodrome that held 20,000 spectators for chariot races.

# Jerusalem Old City Highlights

**DAY 7 THURSDAY, 24 DECEMBER 2026**

- **Breakfast at the hotel**
- **Morning lookout at Haas Promenade** From the Haas Promenade take in a wide view of Jerusalem's Old and New Cities and the surrounding Judean Desert as far as the eye can see. See Jerusalem's complex geography, strategic setting, and beauty. Begin the conversation about Jerusalem's centrality to Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.
- **City of David** Take a trip back in time through the layers of Jerusalem's past. It was on this hill where King David founded the Kingdom of Israel capital, and where it continuously excavated over the last 120 years, discoveries are regularly made. Tour the palace of King David, ritual purification pools, and the tour's highlight - a walk through water in Hezekiah's Tunnel built to protect the water supply. Exit the site onto the magnificent road where the Jewish pilgrims walked, over 2,000 years ago. Get your flashlights ready!  
Please note: The walk in the tunnel isn't suitable for claustrophobic people. What to bring? water shoes, a flashlight, shorts, and a change of modest clothes for the rest of the day in the Old City.
- **Davidson Center** Walk through the Southern Wall Archaeological Gardens. Get a glimpse of the glory of the Second Temple, the heart of the ancient Jewish kingdom, and the devastation that followed. Visit the Davidson Visitors' Center and enjoy a modern and interactive virtual presentation. The museum presents a taste of the archaeology of Jerusalem from different eras - covering the First Temple, Second Temple, Byzantine, Islamic, and the Crusades periods.
- **Western Wall** Take time to reflect at the Kotel (The Western Wall), sacred because it is one of the last remnants of the Second Temple that was destroyed by the Romans. Feel the stones that have witnessed so much in the history of the Jews. Place your special and personal prayer in the cracks of the stones.
- **The Jewish Quarter Jerusalem** The Jewish Quarter is best known for the Western Wall, but there's a lot more to see and do here. See archaeological finds from the First and Second Temple periods, Roman ruins, vibrant synagogues, and learning institutions, all jostling for space in these busy stone streets.

**DAY 8 FRIDAY, 25 DECEMBER 2026**

- **Tour Ein Karem** Step into another world while you visit the quaint Ein Karem neighborhood, which is tucked into the hills of Jerusalem. This is the biblical Ein Karem village, whose name means "the spring in the vineyard." Wander through this serene neighborhood, visit impressive churches like the Church of the Visitation, explore local art galleries, and discover the village's rich cultural and religious heritage
- **Eden Tamir Music Center** Nestled in historic Ein-Kerem in Jerusalem, the Eden Tamir Music Center hosts intimate chamber-music concerts—imagine a Saturday evening recital in a candle-lit room where world-class artistry meets warm local charm.
- **Optional: Yad Vashem** Visit the museum at Yad Vashem, Israel's National Memorial to the Holocaust. Tour this memorial to the darkest moment in the world and Jewish history, its children's memorial, and exquisite gardens. Yad Vashem is an unforgettable place of tribute and remembrance. You'll be guided by a member of the Yad Vashem staff.
- **Rest back at the hotel** And prepare for Shabbat

# Masada & Dead Sea

**DAY 9 SATURDAY, 26 DECEMBER 2026**

- **Breakfast at the hotel**
- **Early morning drive south**
- **Masada National Park** Ascend the mountain by cable car to explore Masada, a natural fortress combining natural beauty and deep meaning. Explore the impressive excavations that reveal secrets of daily life in the fortress, hear about the scene of the epic stand by Jewish rebels at the end of the Great Revolt against Rome nearly 2,000 years ago, and how the site became one of Israel's most important symbols.  
Note: the hiking route is only accessible in the very early morning, otherwise, we recommend ascending by cable car
- **Dead Sea Resort for swim and lunch Nevo Isrotel Hotel** Experience the lowest point on Earth: a stunning landscape of shimmering water and desert hills. Float in the Dead Sea's healing minerals, enjoy the spa facilities, and have lunch
- **Optional: Ein Gedi Ancient Synagogue** The landscape, climatic conditions and water sources at the Ein Gedi Nature Reserve have created a unique ecosystem of springs, waterfalls and pools surrounded by lush greenery in a desolate desert setting. Hike up to and cool off in the refreshing pools and waterfalls of the Ein Gedi Nature Reserve. The stunning Ein Gedi oasis consists of two separate waterways: Nahal David (David's Stream), and Nahal Arugot, where remains of a 6th-century synagogue were discovered.
- **Drive back north** Dinner on own

## From Jerusalem to Tel Aviv: Cultural & Culinary Hubs

**DAY 10 SUNDAY, 27 DECEMBER 2026**

- **Half day to rest** And then check out of the hotel
- **Tour Mishkenot Sha'ananim** Explore the picturesque neighborhood and rich cultural heritage of Mishkenot Sha'ananim, the first Jewish residential area built outside the Old City walls in 1860 by British philanthropist Moses Montefiore to help the Jews of the Old Yishuv. While wandering through the quaint alleys, hear about its history, the people who lived here, and how it has changed over the years. The landscapes of the Old City walls and Mount Zion serve as a background and add to the beauty of this place.
- **Machane Yehuda Market** In the heart of Jerusalem sits this bustling, multi-ethnic market bursting with life, art, and flavor. Immerse yourself in the world of Middle Eastern cuisine as you indulge in a tasting tour through Machane Yehuda Market. Learn about the market's rich history, and meet the vendors who bring this place to life, as you experience the vibrant energy unique to this iconic culinary destination.
- **Leave Jerusalem and drive to Tel Aviv**
- **Check in to your hotel**
- **Evening tour of Sarona** Sarona is a renovated complex in the heart of Tel Aviv, originally a German Templar Colony, the site sits at the heart of what is a new central business district of the city, with offices and apartments surrounding the beautifully landscaped complex, in which 33 original Templar buildings dating up to more than 140 years, have been painstakingly restored, and today house boutique stores, artist galleries, quaint cafes, and some of the city's hottest restaurants and bars.

# Jaffa, the White City, & Neve Tzedek

**DAY 11 MONDAY, 28 DECEMBER 2026**

- **Breakfast at the hotel**
- **Old Jaffa** Explore the enchanting charm of Old Jaffa, where ancient and modern are situated side-by-side and where people of all faiths meet. Jaffa is one of the most ancient port cities in the Mediterranean basin. Visit Jaffa Port, which for centuries was the gateway to the Land of Israel. Today Jaffa is a mixed city, where Jews and Arabs live alongside each other. Tel Aviv, Jaffa's much younger sister, was established centuries later, but the two were united into one municipality already in 1949, yet each part kept its unique feel and atmosphere. visit vibrant artist studios as well as archeological discoveries, while exploring the rich tapestry of cultures and history that defines this timeless Mediterranean gem.
- **Hummus Abu Hassan** Make a stop at Abu Hassan which started out in 1959 with a small hummus stand with two pots on Hadolphin Street near the Jaffa port and is now legendary.
- **Neve Tzedek** Neve Tzedek is the first Jewish neighborhood to be built outside of Jaffa and is now one of the most beautiful and desirable locations in Tel Aviv. It was built in 1887 by dignitaries of the old Jewish community of Jaffa. Looking to head out of the ever-growing and over-crowded Jaffa, they built, what was considered back then, modern and comfortable housing.. In recent years, the neighborhood was restored and has become a trendy fun beautiful part of the city and a good place to try some Israeli Gelato!
- **The White City walking tour** Explore Lev Ha'ir, the Heart of the City, where the first roots of Tel Aviv were planted in 1909. Lev Hair contains some of Tel Aviv's most beautiful buildings, being at the center of the UNESCO designated "White City" known for its Bauhaus, Eclectic, and International Style architecture. The area is densely populated, rooted in history, and with a glance towards the future with impressive skyscrapers, and a high concentration of start-up companies. Bordered by Habima Theater in the north and Florentin and Neve Tzedek in the south, Lev Ha'ir is a gateway to almost every district in the city. Lev Ha'ir is a cultural hub, filled with galleries, restaurants and parks.
- **Rothschild Boulevard** Rothschild Boulevard was one of the first streets to be built in the city of Tel Aviv a little over 100 years ago. In the heart of the "White City", it is lined with Tel Aviv's iconic architecture, the Bauhaus style, which led to its recognition as a UNESCO World Heritage site. Many of these buildings have been beautifully restored and now house the offices of financial institutions, creative firms, cafes, and luxury residences.

- **Nova music festival site** Stop at the Nova Festival memorial site at Re'im Forest stop and bear witness to the tragedy of the Nova Festival.
- **Osi Lankri Culinary Queen Catering Ofakim** Recognized as one of Ofakim's "Culinary Queens," Osi invites you to savor a home-cooked meal in her beautiful home. While enjoying the culinary experience, listen to her personal stories about life in the Envelope, her birthplace and hometown. Gain insights into how the October 7th attack affected her home, family, and neighborhood.
- **Sderot Police Station Memorial** Built on the ruined police station, the "Pillars of Eternity" honors October 7 victims with eighteen soaring columns symbolizing resilience and hope
- **Drive back to Tel Aviv** With dinner on route

**DAY 13 WEDNESDAY, 30 DECEMBER 2026**

- **Carmel Market (Shuk HaCarmel)** A culinary and cultural experience in the Carmel Market (Shuk HaCarmel), the largest market in Tel Aviv. Touring the market reveals the taste of the ages of Tel Aviv in the youthful atmosphere felt here. The Polish, the Persian, and the Yemeni...in this case, it is not the opening line of a joke, but the fascinating culinary traditions that mix in this place. Founded over 90 years ago, discover the many secrets, stories, and legends of this culinary destination. Enjoy tastings throughout the tour.
- **Graffiti Tour** Explore contemporary Israeli culture through an urban inquisitive graffiti tour in the Florentin neighborhood. What stories do these images and words tell about the people living here? What social issues are reflected in the art on the walls? What is unique about graffiti in Israel and Tel Aviv specifically? In this dynamic tour through Florentin, Tel Aviv's best-known neighborhood for graffiti, you will answer these questions, share your interpretations, and gain an appreciation for this expressive form of art.
- **Optional: Ayalon Institute** The Ayalon Institute is a clandestine ammunition factory built in 1945 by the Haganah, a Zionist paramilitary organization. Above ground, it appeared to be no more than a kibbutz bakery. However, eight meters below ground was really the country's largest bullet factory. It has been said that the bullets manufactured at the Ayalon Institute played a crucial role in the success of the War of Independence.
